DEATH OF JUDGE S. D. SCHUMCKER

Native and Distinguished Son of Gettysburg Dies in Baltimore after an Illness of Several Weeks. Brief Biographical Sketch.

Judge Samuel D. Schumcker, of the Maryland Court of Appeals, one of Gettysburg's most distinguished sons, died Friday night at the 'Union' Presbyterian Infirmary, Baltimore, where he was taken on Sunday, February 19, 1911.

He was born in Pennsylvania on the 15th of March, 1834, and his name indicates, was of German descent. His father, Rev. Samuel S. Schumcker, was perhaps one of the ablest ministers of the city.

He was sent to Pennsylvania to be graduated with the class of 1861. He then took the two year course at the Law School of the University of New York, graduating in 1865.

He was admitted to the bar in 1866 and practiced his profession in 1865, then returned to his native city. He was associated himself with Messrs. Whitbeck and the firm of Schumcker and Whitbeck grew to be one of the leading law firms of the city.

He was in 1890, when he was appointed judge of the Court of Appeals, to succeed William Shepley Bryan, Jr. Judge Schumcker who had been a member of the bar since 1866, was a member of the bar since 1866.
